The *Barrow News* 13 March 1948 carried a Death Notice for Isaac Shackley. The following week, 20 March 1948, there was a fuller obituary and account of the funeral:

MR I. SHACKLEY, RAMPSIDE

A well-known and respected resident, Mr. Isaac Shackley of Parkfield, who died on 10 March, was buried at Rampside on Saturday, the former vicar of Rampside, the Rev. H. Robinson, conducting the service.

Mr. S. Lees was the organist, and the hymns "Abide with me", and "Jesu, lover of my soul", and the 23rd Psalm being sung.

Mr. Shackley, who was 74, was a master baker and had been in the bakery business for many years. He founded the firm of Messrs. Shackley Ltd., in 1915, and held the position of Managing Director.

The **1939 England and Wales Register** has Isaac Shackley, (born 15 September 1873) Retired Baker, living at Parkfield, Rampside, along with Rose H. Shackley (born 6 August 1876), unpaid domestic duties; John C. Dearden (born 10 November 1897), Wholesale and Retail Baker; and Polly Dearden (born 7 November 1899), Bakery Manageress. John was an A.R.P. Warden in Barrow; Polly was responsible for a First Aid Post .

The **1901 Census** has Isaac, Rose and Polly (daughter) living at 18 Union Street, Barrow. He is described as a Journeyman Baker and Breadmaker. He was born in Askam-in-Furness, and Rose was born in Bury. Sharing the household was sister-in-law Polly Riley, aged 21.
